ENROLLMENT 2022-23

"We have now begun the 2022-2023 NEW STUDENT enrollment process. We are now accepting applications for NEW siblings (including kindergarten students) and transfers. Please remember that new kindergarten students must be 5 on or before September 1st to qualify for enrollment; there are no exceptions to this rule. Lotteries will begin on January 3rd so make sure you have completed the application prior to then to increase the likelihood of receiving your priority enrollment status. Please visit www.americanprep.org/enrollment to complete the application.

The codes for siblings (including kinder), staff, transfer, etc. are as follows: sibling2022, staff2022, transfer2022, and we have added a section for Covid re-enrollment using code covid2022.

HIGHLY QUALIFIED TEACHER:


